COURSE DESCRIPTION

Course objectives

The goal of the course is to enable participants to understand the main idea of a complex text on concrete and abstract topics, including expert discussions in their own field of specialization, then to develop the fluency and spontaneity of expression that is necessary to communicate with native speakers regularly and effortlessly, the production of clear, detailed texts on a wide range of topics and explaining your point of view on a current topic, stating the advantages and disadvantages of different approaches.

Enrolment requirements and entry competencies

All participants are obliged to take the initial test of knowledge of the Croatian language and the Latin alphabet.
